- AAAS 103 Introduction to Africa ONLINE 06/05 -7/27/18 Keathley  
An introduction to the interdisciplinary study of African cultures and societies focusing on contemporary life on the continent. Topics to be covered include the geography, history, politics and economics of the continent, as well as the religion, languages and literatures, music and the arts. The interdisciplinary perspective will provide students with a sound basis for understanding contemporary African societies.

- AAAS 106 The Black Experience in the Americas ONLINE 06/05 -7/27/18 Adams  
An interdisciplinary study of the history and culture of Black people in America from Reconstruction to the present. Topics covered include an analysis of Reconstruction, Black leaders, organizations and movements, the Harlem Renaissance, migration, and race relations. Demographic variables covered include socio-economic class, education, political persuasion, and influence by avant-garde cultural changes. (Same as HIST 359.)
- AAAS 306 Black Experiences in the US since Emancipation ONLINE 06/05 -7/27/18 Cole  
An interdisciplinary study of the history and culture of Black people in America from Reconstruction to the present. Topics covered include an analysis of Reconstruction, Black leaders, organizations and movements, the Harlem Renaissance, migration, and race relations. Demographic variables covered include socio-economic class, education, political persuasion, and influence by avant-garde cultural changes. (Same as HIST 359.) LEC.
- AAAS 320/555 African Film Fraiser 108 9AM-11:20AM 6/5/2018-6/28/2018 Ukpokodu  
A critical study of Africa and its peoples as depicted in films. The aesthetic, cultural, economic, political, historical, and ideological aspects of African films and videos will be examined. SATISFIES NON-WESTERN CULTURE REQUIREMENT (Same as FMS 530)
- AAAS 323 African-American Families in Film ONLINE 06/05 -7/27/18 Hamer  
Lecture and discussion course in African-American area of current interest. May be repeated for credit toward the major.  
Prerequisite: None.
- AAAS 511 The Civil Rights Movement ONLINE 06/05 -7/27/18 Alexander  
An examination of the Civil Rights Movement in American History. Emphasis is placed on the activities of major Civil Rights organizations, Civil Rights legislation and its impact on American life, and conflicts between integrationist and separatist forces in politics, economics, education, culture and race relations in the United States. LEC.
- ARAB 110 Elementary Arabic I BA 103 MTWR 08:00 -12:40 PM 6/5/2018-6/28/2018 Ali  
Basic level of oral fluency and aural comprehension. Vocabulary acquisition, pronunciation, grammar, and writing. Reading of simple texts. Not open to native speakers of Arabic. LEC
- ARAB 120 Elementary Arabic II BA 104 MTWR 08:00 -12:40 PM 7/02-7/27/18 Ali  
A continuation of ARAB 110. Readings in cultural texts. Prerequisite: ARAB 110. LEC
- Arabic 210 - Intermediate Arabic I BA 110 MTWR 01:00 -05:25 PM 6/5/2018-6/28/2018 Alotaibi  
Intermediate oral proficiency and aural comprehension. Systematic review of grammar. Writing skills beyond the basic level. Introduction to modern Arabic texts and discussion in Arabic. Prerequisite: ARAB 120.

Continuation of ARAB 210. Discussion in Arabic of texts studied. Prerequisite: ARAB 210.

KISW 110 Elementary KiSwahili I      MTWR 08:00 -12:40 PM      WES 4038 6/5/2018-6/28/2018      Ojiambo  
Basic level or oral fluency and aural comprehension. Vocabulary acquisition, pronunciation, grammar, and writing. Reading of simple texts. Not open to native speakers of KiSwahili.

KISW 120 Elementary KiSwahili II      MTWR 08:00 -12:40 PM      WES 4038 7/02-7/27/18      Mwangi  
A continuation of KISW 110. Readings in cultural texts. Prerequisite: KISW 110.

KISW 210 Intermediate KiSwahili I      MTWR 01:00 -05:25 PM      BA 103 6/5/2018-6/28/2018      Ojiambo  
Class conducted in KiSwahili. Intermediate oral proficiency and aural comprehension. Systematic review of grammar. Writing skills beyond the basic level. Introduction to modern KiSwahili texts and discussion in KiSwahili. Prerequisite: KISW 120

KISW 220 Intermediate KiSwahili II      MTWR 01:00 -05:25 PM      BA 103 7/02-7/27/18      Mwangi  
Class conducted in KiSwahili. Continuation of KISW 210. Discussion in KiSwahili of texts studied. Prerequisite: KISW 210.

WOLO 110 Elementary Wolof I      MTWR 08:00 -12:40 PM      FR 107 6/5/2018-6/28/2018      Ba  
Five hours of class per week. Basic level of oral fluency and aural comprehension. Vocabulary acquisition, pronunciation, grammar, and writing. Reading of simple texts. Not open to native speakers of Wolof.

WOLO 120 Elementary Wolof II      MTWR 08:00 -12:40 PM      FR 106 7/02-7/27/18      Ba  
Five hours of class per week. A continuation of WOLO 110. Readings in cultural texts. Prerequisite: WOLO 110

Arabic Studies in Ifrane, Morocco, Al-Akhawayn University

ARAB 110 Elementary Arabic I  
Five credits. For the novice speaker who wishes to learn Arabic in a culturally immersed context.

ARAB 120 Elementary Arabic II  
Five credits. A continuation of Elementary Arabic I

ARAB 210 Intermediate Arabic I  
Three credits. For the student who has completed one year of Arabic language study who wishes to hone and further their skills in an Arabic-speaking environment.

ARAB 220 Intermediate Arabic II  
Three credits. A continuation of Intermediate Arabic I.

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ARAB 310 Advanced Arabic I

Three credits. For the student who has completed two years of Arabic language study.

ARAB 320 Advanced Arabic II

A continuation of ARAB 310. Prerequisite: Satisfactory completion of ARAB 310 or consent of instructor
